Thinking Outside The Box in Education and Economic Development: Connecticut Promise Zones

In 2005, the city of Kalamazoo, Michigan, began an unprecedented experiment in education and economic development that guarantees full college scholarships to potentially every graduate of the public school system. As a result, school enrollment and graduation rates are rising. The school population is becoming more racially integrated, and there has been a significant impact on the economy. The Connecticut State Legislature is currently considering a bill that would create a similar program called *Connecticut Promise Zones*.
