• State of the City Address 2006: Mayor Eddie Perez addresses the City Council, reviewing progress and outlining plans for the coming year in education, housing, neighborhoods, public safety and more. - **Getting Connecticut's Fiscal Ship in Order:** This March 2006 report from Connecticut Voices for Children highlights some of the reasons why Connecticut's fiscal situation remains troubling, notwithstanding its current surplus. - *Plasma Arc Technology: A Solution to Hartford's Landfill?* Plasma Arc technology offers a possible solution to the Hartford landfill in the North Meadows. In March, 2006, Professor Louis J. Cicero of the Plasma Applications Research Program at Georgia Tech Research Institute made a presentation in Hartford. Two Power Point presentations are included here: *Plasma Processing of Municipal Solid Waste at Coal-Fired Power Plants*, and *Engineering & Environmental Applications of Plasma Arc Technology*. - Fair Funding: Let's Find a Better Way to Finance Local Education in Connecticut. This document reports on the study and resulting recommendations of an investigation on the issue of education funding in Connecticut, performed by the Citizens Network of the Capital Region. - Federal Tax Burdens and Expenditures by State Special Report: The Tax Foundation's annual federal tax burden and expenditure study clarifies the geographical patterns of income redistribution that federal tax and spending policies cause each year. In fiscal year 2004, residents of Connecticut were paying 166 percent of the national average in federal taxes. Through an agreement with *The Hartford Courant*, HartfordInfo.org continues to offer selected *Courant* articles as permanent additions to the web site. Some recent additions include:

- At Long Last, Getting Feet On The Street: Almost eight years since Adriaen's Landing began the now \$2 billion worth of public and private investment in downtown Hartford, there is at least one truism: Development has begotten development. - **Perez Tax Plan Bucks Norm**: Mayor Perez is proposing tying property taxes to a homeowner's income. - Volunteers Embrace Refugees' Needs: Volunteers provide support services to refugees through an outreach program sponsored by Jubilee House, an education center in Hartford that offers an array of services. - Lessons From Providence: Much has been written about the comeback of downtown Providence. Is Providence's success a model for Hartford? Go to <u>www.hartfordinfo.org</u> and type "from providence" in the Google search box and then click "Search."
- State Must Do Math On Charters: Stan Simpson writes in support of a bill that would remove the enrollment caps on charter schools and provide them funding at the same levels as the conventional public schools. - *River Was Where Road Is*: In this opinion piece, Wilson H. Faude discusses the Metropolitan District Commission plans to tap a brook in Bloomfield and have it flow in Bushnell Park along the former path of the Park River. - A Class Struggle: To comply with a landmark court case on educating children with learning disabilities or emotional problems, the Hartford public school system in September 2005 transferred 1,300 special education students from segregated programs to neighborhood schools. - A Lift For Low-Wage Workers: While bankers on Wall Street enjoy a \$21.5 billion bonus season, another bonus ritual is playing out for thousands of low-wage Connecticut workers: the earned income tax credit. - **Breakthrough School Is Educators' Dream**: Breakthrough Magnet School will move to the newly constructed building on Brookfield Street in Hartford in spring 2006. It is the first city-run magnet school to move into digs built from the ground up just for them. Go to <u>www.hartfordinfo.org</u> and type "breakthrough school" in the Google search box and then click "Search."
- Front Street Back In Play: The authority in charge of the state's investment in Hartford took a key step recently, voting to move forward with an agreement for a developer to build a long-delayed retail, residential and entertainment conduit between the convention center and downtown Hartford. Go to www.hartfordinfo.org and type "front back" in the Google search box and then click "Search."
- Urban Violence Drawing Attention: In a closed-door meeting held recently at the Capitol with more than a dozen mayors, Gov. M. Jodi Rell said she was open to revising her proposed budget and address mayoral concerns about how best to curb urban violence. Go to <u>www.hartfordinfo.org</u> and type "drawing attention" in the Google search box and then click "Search."
- **Replacing Schools Chief A Challenge For City**: Hartford is hustling to find a superintendent to take over for Robert Henry, whose resignation becomes effective in June. Go to <u>www.hartfordinfo.org</u> and type "replacing chief" in the Google search box and then click "Search."
