Celebrating Housing Opportunities in Hartford!

410 Asylum Street: A Symbol of Preservation and Progress! This once vacant building in Downtown Hartford is being transformed into 70 energy efficient and affordable housing units as well as street-level retail opportunities.

As Mayor, I am proud of the fact that this restoration project means jobs. It also means workforce housing for young professionals. Residents will be able to live close to major businesses as well as shops, restaurants, museums, parks, and entertainment venues. The location near Union Station is also unique as we strive for regional transportation. All of this means a more vibrant Hartford!

The environmental factor is a big feature. This will be the first LEED certified green multi-family residence in Connecticut. So, as one of America's oldest cities continues to preserve its past, it will be a greener Hartford in the future! **Construction is scheduled to be complete in June 2009.**
