



Town of Avon Workforce Profile

The Town of Avon is located 9 miles west of Hartford, has a land area of approximately 23 square miles and is home to 16,812 residents.

Avon's population is comprised of 92% Whites, 1% Blacks, 2% Hispanics, and 5% Other/Multi-Race individuals.







Avon's median age is 44. The age distribution is demonstrated in the pie chart to the left.

Of Avon residents age 25+, 4% do not have a high school diploma, 31% possess a diploma or some college, and 65% have earned an Associate's degree or higher (State: 16%, 46%, and 38% respectively).

The 2003 cumulative dropout rate for the school district was 0% (same as the previous year) and 92% of its graduates pursue post-secondary education (down 4.1%).





Twenty-one (21) percent of Avon's population 16+ function at literacy levels one and two (out of five levels, five being the highest). Individuals at levels one or two would <u>not</u> be able to read an ATM screen, decipher a bus schedule, read a newspaper, read the dosage on a medicine bottle, or fill out a job application.
