



Town of Manchester Workforce Profile

The Town of Manchester, incorporated in 1832, is located 8 miles east of Hartford. It has a land area of 27 square miles and is home to 57,079 residents.

Manchester's population is comprised of 76% Whites, 8% Blacks, 7% Hispanics, and 9% Other/Multi-Race individuals.







Manchester's median age is 38. The age distribution is demonstrated in the pie chart to the left.

Of Manchester residents age 25+, 12% do not have a high school diploma, 50% possess a diploma or some college, and 38% have earned an Associate's degree or higher (State: 16%, 46%, and 38% respectively).

The 2003 cumulative dropout rate was 6.8% (down 6.1% from the previous year) and 82.8% of graduates pursue post-secondary education (up 2%).





Thirty-five (35) percent of Manchester's population 16 and over function at literacy levels one and two (out of five levels, five being the highest). Individuals at levels one or two would not be able to read an ATM screen, decipher a bus schedule, read a newspaper, read the dosage on a medicine bottle, or fill out a job application.

Manchester is considered a great place to live, work and raise a family. It has one of the largest retail concentrations in the northeast along with industrial parks and a historic Main Street.
